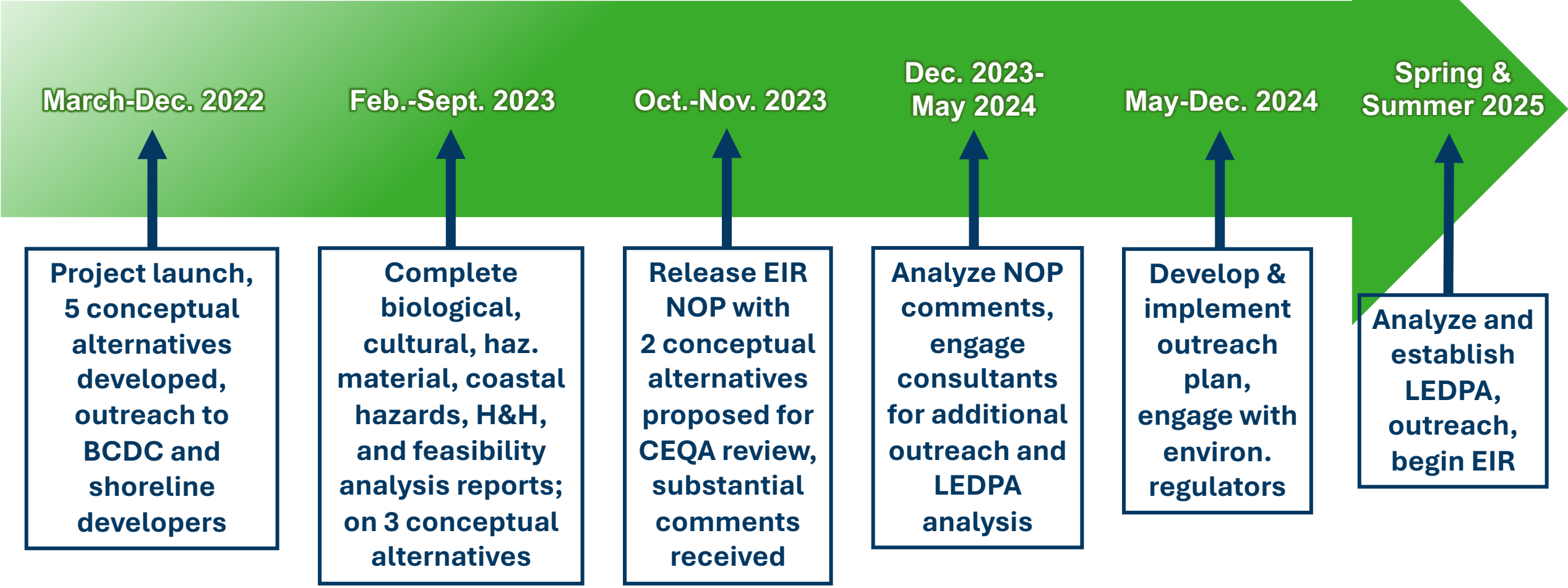

Project Progress to Date and Next Steps



Overview of Outreach and Engagement Plan

- This climate-forward, complex, and constrained project requires meaningful collaboration with many key audiences.
- To enhance OneShoreline's capacity to meaningfully engage these key audiences, on May 20, 2024 the Board authorized a new contract with Civic Edge Consulting to develop, and implement portions of, an outreach plan.
- Since contract execution, Civic Edge has worked closely with OneShoreline staff to develop the draft outreach plan for presentation today.



Outreach and Engagement Plan Goals

- **Develop a cohesive strategy** that builds a common understanding among partners and key audiences of project objectives, constraints, opportunities, and alternatives
- **Clearly communicate** project updates and milestones so key audiences feel informed and engaged
- **Collect meaningful input** from key audiences
- **Track engagement metrics** and how feedback has been incorporated into the project
- **Raise public awareness about OneShoreline and its climate resilience mission**

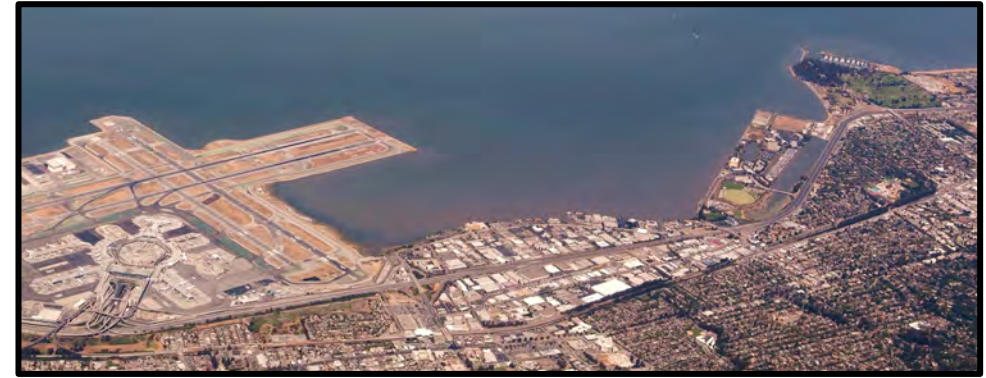
Community Conversations

Civic Edge met with 14 individuals or groups to discuss outreach and engagement.

Key themes:

- **There is a strong desire for opportunities for direct feedback** on alternative designs before they move to further analysis.
- **There remains a perception that there is a preferred alternative.** Increased transparency around process and alternatives is needed.
- **Outreach beyond Millbrae and Burlingame shoreline communities is important.**
- **Clear communications about nature based solutions/features are needed.**
- **Increased coordination with landowners (like SFO) and permitting agencies** before public engagement is desired.

Community Conversations



We also heard:

- **Need for clear materials** that articulate the risks, constraints, and a clear decision space
- **Create multiple opportunities/meetings** for the public to weigh in
- Invite **community based organizations and landowners** to the table to offer input outside of community meetings
- **Cities of Millbrae and Burlingame** are ready to collaborate with venues, promotion support, etc.

Community Conversations

Summary of recommendations for outreach:

- Coordinate meetings with landowners and regulators first, then proceed with public engagement
- “Show your work” and enhance transparency via regular website updates, newsletters, etc.
- Engage communities beyond the Bay shoreline
- Create clear materials and place-based engagement
- Partner with the Cities of Millbrae and Burlingame on upcoming outreach

Update on Colma Creek activities

Maintenance:

- **Upstream (west) of Hwy. 101: Almost one mile of debris removal, including 400 cubic yards of sediment; repair fence at Centennial Way pedestrian bridge; clean and repair culverts**
- **Downstream (east) of Hwy. 101: Culvert Repair and Replacement Project to be completed by October**

Agenda Item 6 CEO's Report Update on grant award to protect portions of San Bruno & SSF

From a 2022 application, FEMA recently awarded OneShoreline \$900,000 to reduce San Bruno and SSF flooding, which will increase with more extreme storms and sea level rise.

This project includes the **shoreline** from the south end of SSF's water treatment plant (WTP) to the south bank of the mouth of San Bruno Creek (where OneShoreline owns a **tide gate**), and **along the creek** to the Caltrain tracks.

Project tasks include:

- close data gaps, builds upon OneShoreline contracts
- engage stakeholders and the public
- develop project alternatives, cost estimates, and the conceptual design of a preferred alternative
- develop project description for a CEQA document
- develop an application for further FEMA funding



Agenda Item 6 CEO's Report Flood-Prone Bayside Creeks Maintenance Permit

Following consultation with cities and the County, OneShoreline proposed to environmental permitting agencies a 5-year program to remove accumulated sediment, vegetation, and debris in **targeted flood-prone locations** of San Bruno, Belmont, and Cordilleras creeks, and Atherton Channel.

On June 24, 2024, the Board approved an Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration and in July OneShoreline filed a Notice of Determination.

Permit reviews are ongoing with the Corps of Engineers, Regional Water Board, and CA Department of Fish and Wildlife, and OneShoreline is now re-engaging with the cities and County regarding project implementation and project mitigations.

Anticipated required mitigation, likely to be met through restoration within a local watershed, totals approximately 0.1 acre from temporary impacts and approximately 0.02 acre from permanent impacts.

Update on a OneShoreline request for the Corps of Engineers to study a federal project to build resilience for the Sewer Authority Mid-Coastside (SAM) water treatment plant

In early March, SAM requested that OneShoreline seek federal funds for a climate resilience project for the flood-prone plant.

On March 25, the OneShoreline Board authorized the Chair to submit letters to Rep. Eshoo and California's two U.S. Senators seeking this funding. Letters of support were provided by Assemblymember Berman, and the Mayor of Half Moon Bay and SAM Board Chair.

All three federal offices requested this funding, and we're very optimistic that by 2025 the Corps will begin an analysis to determine if there's a federal interest in this project, which is the first phase of any Corps involvement.
