What is a Community Lead?

From now through the week of April 8, 2024, Community Leads make at least one submission a week via email or text that captures their experience, observations, or feelings regarding flooding, severe weather, or other aspects of safety and resilience during the winter months.

Examples of submissions include:

- Photos or videos when it's raining and flooding
- Voice memos or audio messages with your thoughts
- Photos or screenshots of written notes

The observations, stories, and experiences you share will help our local community and regional agencies take action to create a safer, more resilient San Bruno.
